
A Profound Loss to Our BMW Community

All of us have met unique individuals who "have changed our lives". For the Stewart household, Ozzie Auer was that very special person. His reputation within the international BMW family is unparalleled. As a businessman, he personified the passion that makes our chosen motorcycle marque different from others. Ozzie's BMW in Chico, California was a haven for motorcyclists who were enriched by his expert technical skills as well as his old world way of doing business.

A true family shop, wife Emmi and grandson Jesse, continue in a tradition of placing the customer at the focus of every action. All of us like BMW motorcycles, Ozzie Auer lived them. Campaigning his superb, hand-crafted vintage machines throughout the United States and Canada, he wanted to show that old BMW's were certainly not an old man's' motorcycle. How about spinning his 1939 500cc race bike at 9000 rpm? As a side-car racer, he won the AMA Number One plate against the likes of his friend Reg Pridmore. Twenty-five years ago I personally rode two of his solo race bikes – albeit only in the pits – and can still feel the sensation.

At Barber's Museum in Birmingham, Alabama I met a visitor from Germany. When he saw my Ozzie's BMW shirt, he asked, "Do you know Ozzie? My friends in Germany said that when I visit America, I must meet Ozzie."

The business card for the Chico shop also listed his home phone number. The usual response upon his answering was, "Where do I need to come and help you?"

NW Ambassadors Ride Report-February 2015

One would be hard pressed to tell we live in the Pacific Northwest this winter. Yes, the gray gloom has persisted since November. But the weather has been unseasonably mild and while it has rained normal amounts, it seems to have come in very contained bursts. As for snow, well, it's been a big swing-and-amiss. As of the first of February, northern Oregon snowpack stood at 16% of normal.



All this weather commentary should have served as an invitation to another balmy, comfortable, early season February First Saturday ride. As late as the Thursday before, your humble correspondent enjoyed dry pavement as he pre-rode over hill

and dale. Unfortunately, he also picked up a cold. And that cold, along with one of those rainbursts, served as excuses to cancel February's ride.

For all but one of us. **Ric Holderbaum** would not be denied. He had missed my last minute email blast. He wasn't one of the distant few I called to keep them from riding for naught. He did chat with Rainer at Tigard BMW, who I had asked to inform anyone who slipped through my net. But Ric was a man on a mission.

And it was easy to see why. For as hard as it rained while I typed my cancellation email, it abruptly stopped the moment I hit [Send]. By the time I walked downstairs to inform my passenger, patches of blue dotted the sky. And for the next three hours I sat by the window, gnashing my teeth. More sun than clouds – and not a drop of rain to be seen.

The exclamation point on my rash decision-making arrived late that afternoon with this ride report from Mr. Holderbaum:

1st Saturday ride was a great success; everyone was on time, all the tanks were full and clutches out at 9:45 sharp. As you can see, there was a wet parking lot at Tigard BMW; however, the entire ride was dry. The route was adjusted because of the threatening weather to the east, so the new route (and goal) was to keep the bike heading towards the blue skies at all times. This resulted in a spirited ride, covering over 100 different roads and 175 plus miles of twisties, with panoramic views throughout wine country, and no fewer than 50 spectacular rainbows, wild geese, cranes, and plenty of other bird life. The group stayed together and all arrived at the same time for free lunch at Storrs Smokehouse located

in Newburg. Storrs Smokehouse is owned and operated by the owners of The Painted Lady, which I believe is (or was) the only four-star, four-diamond restaurant in Oregon.

The ride—named the Rainbow Tour—ended back in West Linn with a slight amount of rain in the last half mile. For those that didn't make it, you missed a spectacular ride with nearly perfect road conditions, very little traffic, a balmy 60 degrees, robin-egg blue skies, more rainbows than this writer has ever seen in one day, and a complementary smoked brisket sandwich, with a side of 4 beef ribs, house-made pickles and slaw. I'm not sure if you can have more fun for \$9.49 worth of gas.

The moral of the story? When it comes to ride planning, never give up on the weather. Even in the Pacific Northwest. Oh, and Ric Holderbaum is NW Oregon's Rider-of-the-Month.


