Second Quarterly Meeting of the Membership May 19, 2019

Our president Alice LeBarron called the Second Quarter BWM Riders of Oregon meeting to order Sunday May 19, 2019 under cloudy, cool skies beneath the cool pines behind iconic Shirley's Tippy Canoe in Troutdale, Oregon, alongside the Sandy River.

1. Introductions:

- 5 first timers attending a Club Quarterly meeting
- 23 members in attendance
- Minutes of the first quarter approved

2. Treasurer's Report

Club finances are managed by **Nate Levin**, Treasurer. Nate provided details on balances, revenue and expenses. In sum (though no pun is intended by this) the Club currently has a healthy bank balance: we started Q1 with \$24,955, and Q2 \$33,380 ending balance as of April 30, 2019.

The Executive Committee approved the creation of a club Reserve Account to ensure the security of an Operating budget: \$15k will be set aside prior to the Chief Joseph Rally in a bank account

3. Membership Report

Gavin Silaski introduced himself and the new role of Membership Coordinator that was created last quarter. This role alleviates more than one major responsibility being on one of the Executive Committee members.

Gavin's primary goal is to Grow the

Membership! He is starting by looking at the data (the devil is in the details) and plans to have a plan to share after the Chief Joseph Rally by the 3rd quarter.

Current Membership counts stand at 305 Active Members, 48 in Central/Northeast, 85 in the Central/West, 98 in the Northwest, and 40 in the deep South.

4. Events Report

Chris Henry, Vice President, oversees Events for the club. His report highlighted that the number of events is increasing this year and it's fantastic to have so many creative ideas put forward by volunteers.

Volunteers are the foundation of the BMWRO. We appreciate you! One new policy the Executive Committee approved is that all hosts of events are exempt from the event fee as a gesture of gratitude, and for the work that is involved. We recognize that it's not about the monetary sum, but want to express thanks to those that step forward.




Over the River and Through the Woods...to Glenwood Station We Go! NW Ambassadors Ride Report – May 2019

What a day for a ride! The sun had bathed us for most of the week...and May's first Saturday turned out to be the nicest day of all. After enjoying a complimentary apple fritter (thanks BMW of Western Oregon) and watching the riders stream in, it was time to get down to business. When the sugar high settled and appointed hour arrived, seventeen riders answered the call to roll.

Today's ride was a first in nearly four years — no passengers! Other rarities included a Spyder (courtesy of **Karen Rust**) and a trailer (**Cam**

As we city dwellers know all too well, to get where the action is, you've got to get through town. That's sometimes a struggle, especially when the group is sizeable. Karen, on her Spyder, agreed to tail gun for us. I asked her to edge into traffic, to open a window for our entourage to stay together. No problem, she nodded—until an emergency vehicle, lights and sirens blaring, roared into our path. Karen maneuvered like a pro, then quickly reasserted herself, enabling the rest of us to escape.

Through the Vista Tunnel and over the Marquam Bridge we soared. Onto I-205, across the Columbia, we headed east on WA-14, almost out of the grip of metropolis. After a quick stop to gather our eastside crowd, we would continue on to God's country. Just as planned, near Washougal, waited the rest of our gang — **Steven Polansky, Frank Boyle**, missing person **Andy Sulla** (we hadn't seen him in nineteen months) and his buddy, **Ryan Morrisey** — another first timer. Now that we had everyone, we waited — and waited — for our group to coalesce. Our tail, with three riders, had fallen off. Eventually, Cam, Karen, and John arrived, having missed I-84, ending up in Vancouver. No harm, no foul — the best riding was ahead of us.

After a brief gas stop in North Bonneville, we continued our eastward assault. WA-14 is one of the most scenic drives in the northwest, and with sun blazing, the Columbia shone in all her glory. It's another thirty-five miles or so along the river. On a day like today, I would have gladly ridden another 335.

But we were in pursuit of the road less travelled. Old Highway 8 was the first such find. Just west of Rowland Lake, a left turn takes you on a perfect ribbon of blacktop in the low hills above the Columbia. With the weather and the wildflowers, hikers and their cars were everywhere. But five miles later, we had the road to ourselves.

The next thirty miles were bliss — and a surprise to many.

Canyon Road is a twistfest that climbs out of the Columbia Gorge toward Appleton. The terrain doesn't seem too steep, but before you know it, you've climbed 2,000 feet in just over ten miles. The real surprise comes in the next twenty miles — all the maps suggest the

Needless to say, when we reached our lunch stop in Glenwood, we had plenty to talk about. Glenwood Station is the only game in town and the food is pretty good. Even with fair warning, it took them awhile to serve us, but sitting in the welcome, spring sun, talking about the ride, or the weather, or the Blazers, no one seemed to mind. Our rabid fan Polansky even had time to pull out his drone and wow us with his manual dexterity (he does have quite the touch. And the pictures really are something).

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After another photo stop just outside of town, it was time to get back to it. BZ-Glenwood Highway is the usual route home. Not as steep or twisty as Canyon Road, it's still quite scenic, angling southwest, before intersecting WA-141 south of Trout Lake. WA-141 continues the journey back to the Columbia along the White Salmon River.

We knew we'd lose a number of folks when we got back to the river, but the ride wasn't over yet. The diehards rumbled over the Hood River Bridge for a tour through the town and the valley. Hood River is known for its pears, cherries, and apples and on the pre-ride a week earlier, the orchards were in full bloom and a sight to behold. A week of warm weather had taken away the much of the bloom, but there were still plenty of blossoms to be found in the cooler elevations above Parkdale. After a brief stop for ice cream, we continued to climb Mt. Hood, chasing along the Cooper Spur until it deposited us onto OR-35. One last stop at White River, on the southern shoulder of Mt. Hood, reminded us it was a day for the ages.

From there, we headed home, confident that the summer riding season, at long last, has arrived.


